Program Information: WIC is a state program that provides funding for certain groceries that are important for mothers such as fresh fruits, vegetables, baby food, milk, eggs, beans, cheese. Funding is available for pregnant women and women with children under the age of 5. Guardians such as fathers and grandparents may also enroll their children who are under the age of 5.

To apply: Find the number for the office in your county on the website and call or speak to St. Mary's Legacy Clinic staff for a direct referral. Support documents are required.

Requirements: Families qualify by income (185% of federal poverty line). Noncitizens can apply.
